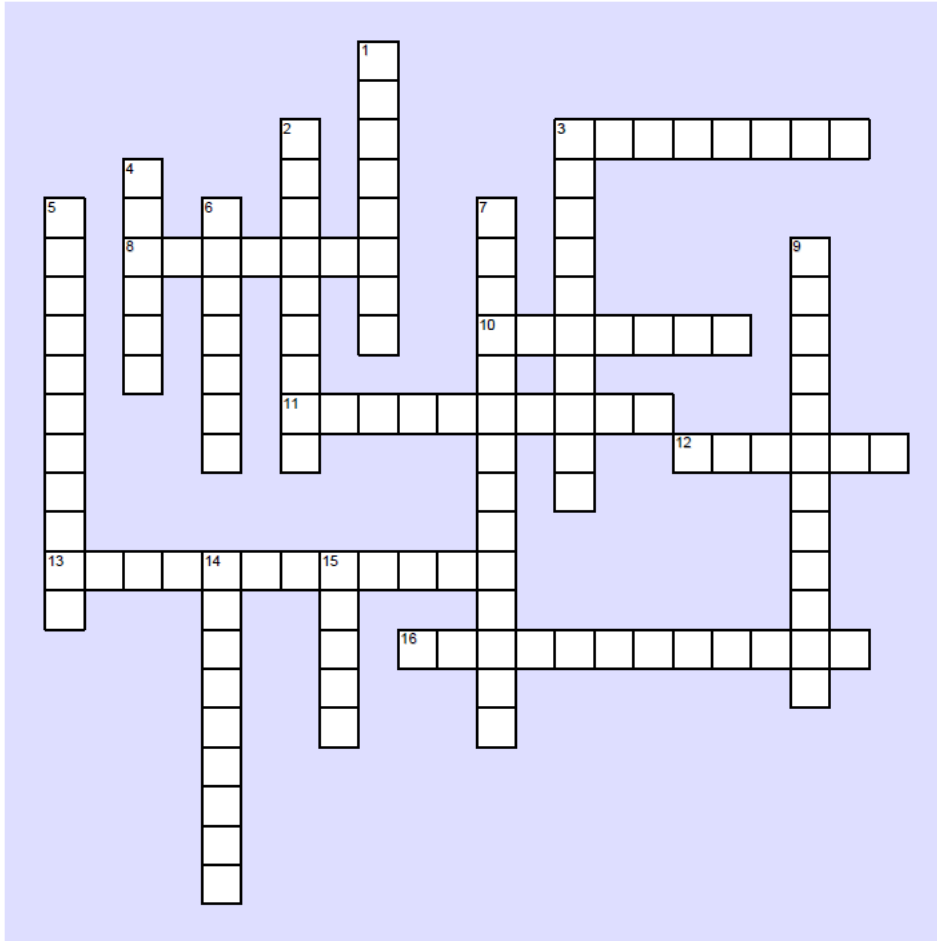


EMANCIPATION PROCLAMATION
